

# Knit for Peace

**All-in-one Jumper  
and beanie hat  
for ages 0-1**

Even in hot countries the nights can be cold, so these tiny baby jumpers are much appreciated when we send them out. We have modified our old pattern to make the sleeves longer and more practical. The jumpers themselves are still very easy to knit and are made in one complete piece. Quick to knit they can be knitted in bright and dark colours using up scraps from your stash, so as not to show the dirt.

## **Materials**

**4mm needles**

**50g DK wool for jumper**

**20g for hat (approx)**

*We used 2 strands of 4ply  
knitted together. Gauge isn't  
too important as  
babies come in all sizes*





## ***All-in-one Jumper and beanie hat for ages 0-1***

### **All-in-one Baby Jumper**

Use double knitting wool and 4mm needles, cast on 44 stitches.  
Work 18 rows in k2, p2 rib.  
Work 30 rows stocking stitch (1 row plain, 1 row purl).

### **Sleeves**

Cast on 18 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows (80 sts in total) and at the same time change to k2, p2 rib (for bodice) and st st for the sleeves.

Work in st st for 18 sts and then work in rib for the central 44 sts.  
Work 22 more rows.

### **Neck opening**

Next row: knit 18, rib 9, cast off 26 stitches, rib 9, knit 18 (Please cast these stitches off very loosely in rib, to allow the neck to stretch over a baby's head)

Next row: purl 18, rib 9, cast on 26 sts, rib 9, purl 18 (Please cast these stitches on loosely, using one size larger needles if necessary).

Work 22 rows in k2, p2 rib and st st.

Cast off 18 sts at beginning of next 2 rows.

Work 30 rows stocking stitch.

Work 18 rows, k2, p2 rib.

Cast off. Sew side and sleeve seams.

### **Baby Beanie Hat Pattern**

Using dk wool and 4mm needles cast on 64 sts and work 14 rows in k1, p1 rib.

Work 18 rows in st st or until work measures 11cm from cast on edge

### **Shape crown**

Row 1: \*k6, k2tog. Repeat from \* to end of row (56 sts)

Row 2 and every alternate row: Knit  
Row 3: \*k5, k2tog. Repeat from \* to end of row (48 stitches).

Row 5: \*k4, k2tog. Repeat from \* to end of row (40 stitches).

Continue decreasing in this manner until (k1 k2tog) has been completed and 16 sts remain.

Knit 1 row. Break yarn and thread through remaining 16 sts.

Pull up tightly and join seam.
